THE STORY OF THIS NIGHT

John 13:selected verses

One: Just before the Passover Feast, Jesus knew that the time had come to leave this world to go to the Father. Having loved his dear companions, he continued to love them right to the end. Jesus knew that he came from God and was on his way back to God. So he got up from the supper table, set aside his robe, and put on an apron. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the feet of the disciples, drying them with his apron. When he got to Simon Peter, Peter said, "Master, are *you* going to wash *my* feet?"

Many: Jesus answered, "You don't understand now what I'm doing, but it will be clear enough to you later."

One: Peter persisted, "You're not going to wash my feet - ever!"

Many: Jesus said, "If I don't wash you, you can't be part of what I'm doing."

One: So Peter said. "Master! Then, not only my feet, but also wash my hands! Wash my head!"

Many: Jesus said, "If you've had a bath in the morning, you only need your feet washed now and you're clean from head to toe. My concern, you understand, is holiness, not hygiene. So now *I say you're clean*."

One: After Jesus had finished washing their feet, he took his robe, put it back on, and went back to his place at the table.

Many: "You address me as 'Teacher' and 'Master,'" he said, "and rightly so. That is what I am. So if I, the Master and Teacher, washed your feet, you must now wash each other's feet. I've laid down a pattern for you. What I've done, you do. Let me give you a new command:

All: Love one another. In the same way I loved you, you should love one another. This is how everyone will recognize that you are my disciples, when they see the love you have for each other."
