Use the door to the left of the pulpit to head downstairs and into the first classroom on the left. A screen is available so that parents can continue to participate in the worship service from the nursery. All bathrooms have changing tables. Pre-K children who are potty trained are welcome to join our elementary Sunday school activities. Sunday School is usually offered on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month, unless otherwise announced.




Mindful Meditation ONLINE Sundays @ 7pm via Zoom
