

NOTE ABOUT COMMUNION

For our celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion / The Eucharist / The Lord's Supper this Sunday in the sanctuary, we'll say thank-you for the gift of pre-packed "astronaut communion" over the last year, as pandemic needs dictated, and say farewell, as well, as we let it go and embark on a new way of sharing the bread and cup of Christ's table.

This Sunday, those present in the sanctuary who wish to partake will be invited to come forward down the center aisle to receive a piece of gluten-free bread from a Deacon (who will be masked) and take for themselves a serving of juice (pre-set in a compostable cup). We'll see how it works—it's been a long time since we've shared with one another in this way—but the Deacons are excited simultaneously to resume their role as servants at the table and explore a simpler way to do that than we've employed in the past.
