This year is different. Old, hateful language about "grooming" and the lie of "protecting the children," once a reliable weapons against gay men and lesbians has been repurposed to attack transgender and nonbinary persons and even drag performers in states across the country. As the tide of anti-LGBTQ+ violence rises in state houses and city streets across the country, playwright Claire Willett posed this question: **"For Pride month this year, can straight people focus less on 'love is love' and more on 'queer and trans people are in danger?"**



And this isn't happening just in places further South and West of us, but right here in Massachusetts. Just this morning, our friends at First Baptist Church, Jamaica Plain, arrive to find this hateful graffiti spraypainted on their church building: "All F++++TS SHOULD DIE. GOD DOES NOT LOVE U. YOUR GOD IS A FRAUD."

This is why it is so crucial for us to be loud and proud in our proclamation of God's radically inclusive love, especially for queer people, especially for queer and trans kids. Not just because there are too many people willing to spew hatred like this, but because there are too many queer people, young and old, who believe them because they've never heard an alternative — and research tell us that this hatred lands with deadly effect on queer youth, in particular. As some online advocates put it bluntly, "We're not trying to turn straight kids into queer kids. We're trying to make sure queer kids don't turn into dead kids."




CHURCH PICNIC after worship THIS SUNDAY, 6/11


SAVE THE DATE! Guatemala Potluck Gathering, Sunday, 7/23 @ 6pm


